

Mock Testimony Assessment

You will be providing testimony to your instructor(s) as your instructor(s) play(s) the parts of the Prosecutor and the Defense attorney. You will be graded on both the content and the quality of the answers you provide while you are “on the witness stand” undergoing Direct Examination and Cross Examination.

The matrix below will be used to assess how well you covered each of the Direct and Cross Examination concepts. You must pass the assessment with a total score of **70 or better** to advance to the certification exam. Your grade on this assessment will make up 50% of your overall *Advanced SCRAM CAM Training* course grade.

Scoring

Except for two of the concepts, every concept will be graded on a five-point scale, where five (5) points shows mastery of the concept, and one (1) point indicates that further study will be required before the witness is ready to testify on that concept. Some concepts are deemed more important than others and are therefore given twice the weight (2x) of other concepts, which increases their maximum point values to 10 points each. A minimum of 70 points is required to pass the assessment and a maximum score of 104 is possible.
